## **Don Internet Armour with new protective device**

With hackers, crackers and other assorted electronic bushwhackers lying in the weeds these days, can you ever be confident your computer and record are safe?

Meet the Burnaby-produced AlphaShield Internet Privacy Protection device that has won raves from such reviewers as SC Online Magazine for its ability to keep nasties at bay. AlphaShield stands four-square behind its product and if you aren't satisfied with their armour, they will gladly hand your money back. They say the armour hasn't been penetrated yet.

It is the next generation of security that should help Net surfers and those that use the net for home business, financial transactions, etc, to rest a lot of better at night.

The little box – truly a plug-and-work device – utilizes three technologies to protect high-speed Internet users.

The external device incorporates AlphaGap, RPA and Stealth IP technology that allows high-speed DSL, ISDN, cable modem and wireless users to surf with security. But is this neat device really necessary?

In a word, yes.

Firewall and anti-virus protectors, while excellent, have nevertheless been breached. AlphaShield adds another vital layer to your protection and works with existing firewalls and anti-virus programs.

The AlphaShield sits between your computer and modem, making your IP address and identity invisible and monitors inbound and outbound transmissions. It also incorporates a neat technology that creates intermittent disconnection to prevent attacks and seamlessly re-establishes the connection.

It is easy to install and doesn't require you to open your system or install any software drivers. In Vancouver, it is available at London Drugs for \$149.99.
